March is Women's History Month!



If all the world's a stage, women have played amazing roles.

Here, Penguin Putnam presents activities and discussion starters to spotlight women's achievements. Except when otherwise noted, they are most appropriate for children in grades 2–6 but can be adapted to suit your needs. Specific age recommendations are provided in this pamphlet's bibliography.

SET THE STAGE

- Survey your students. Ask: Who is a woman you admire or look up to? Record responses on chart paper. Responses may range from
 mothers and movie stars to senators and scientists.
- Then, explain to students that they are going to be learning about important women in history. Ask: Can you think of other women that should be added to the list? Record responses.
- Next, look closely at the list your group has compiled. Ask: Can we break this list down into categories (i.e., political activists, entertainers, writers, teachers)?
- Ask: What do you know about these women?
- Have students ask an adult at home to tell them about a woman they admire or look up to. The next day, have the students share what
 they learned with the class.

INTRODUCE THE PLAYERS

- Create a bulletin board with pictures of notable women. Printable photos can be found on numerous Web sites. Make sure to include
 women from different cultural groups and historic time periods. For example, your display may include pictures of Harriet Tubman, Susan
 B. Anthony, Frida Kahlo and Mother Teresa. Challenge students to help you complete the display; write the women's names on oak tag
 labels and have students match names and faces.
- Start a K-W-L chart. The chart should have three columns: K for "What do you already know about these women;?" W for "What do you want to know;?" and L for "What have you learned?" Start with the first two columns then fill in the last as questions are answered through reading and discussion.
- Put books on display. Use face-out baskets and racks to draw attention to the titles. Allow students to independently choose titles of interest.
- Read aloud. Younger students will especially enjoy stories that focus on the early years of famous folks. Minty: A Story of Young Harriet
 Tubman by Alan Schroeder; Eleanor by Barbara Cooney; and Louisa May & Mr. Thoreau's Flute by Julie Dunlap and Marybeth Lorbiecki
 are excellent choices. Find out what your students already know about these women before you begin reading; provide background
 information as necessary. Ask: How did their experiences as children effect what they did when they grew up?
- Make time for discussion. At the end of each reading period have students report back on what they read or impressions formed during a read-aloud session. Ask: What did you learn that you didn't know before? Did anything surprise you?

RESEARCH THE ROLES

- Have students choose one woman to study in depth. Classroom teachers and librarians can partner to provide outstanding resources
 and support to student researchers. Guiding questions could include: Why is this woman famous? What was her childhood like and how
 did that influence her work as an adult? How did her work effect the lives of others?
- Begin an oral history project. Have students interview mothers, grandmothers, and other female family members to find out what life was
 like when they were growing up. In addition, you may wish to connect with an elder-care facility in your area and have students interview residents. Ask: How was life different for women when you were growing up? What was the same? How have things changed?
 Read aloud A Strong Right Arm: The Story of Mamie "Peanut" Johnson, by Michelle Y. Green, and Tallchief: America's Prima Ballerina
 by Maria Tallchief with Rosemary Wells, to give students a first person perspective on history and a feel for the authenticity of oral
 history.
- Read aloud the profiles in Rabble Rousers: 20 Women Who Made a Difference, by Cheryl Harness. Ask: What qualities do these women
 possess that makes them role models? How did their work make a difference in people's lives?

Make Connections

- Research women's contributions across the curriculum. In movement class read Tallchief: America's Prima Ballerina and Who Is Maria Tallchief?, by Catherine Gourley. Ask: What factors contributed to Maria Tallchief's success as a dancer?
- Explore the life of Louisa May Alcott in language arts lessons by reading Louisa May & Mr. Thoreau's Flute. Ask: What inspired Louisa
 to pursue her writing? Did she always have faith in her abilities? Older readers can refer to Becoming Little Women: Louisa May at
 Fruitlands, by Jeannine Atkins. For another writer's perspective, Laura Ingalls Wilder: Growing Up in the Little House, by Patricia Reilly
 Giff, can also be used for this activity.
- Share Restless Spirit: The Life and Work of Dorothea Lange, by Elizabeth Partridge, in social studies and art classes. Ask: How did Dorothea's work make a difference in the lives of others?

HAVE 'EM SHOW WHAT THEY KNOW . . .

Encourage students to:

- Create a timeline. Individual students may wish to focus on the achievements and events in one woman's life or work together to create
 a timeline that takes a broader view. They can use the timelines in Who Was Annie Oakley?, by Stephanie Spinner, and Rabble Rousers:
 20 Women Who Made a Difference as auides.
- Write a journal entry from the perspective of one of the women they've learned about.
- Design trading cards. On one side, use colored pencils to draw portraits of individual women. (Use Herstory: Women Who Changed the World, edited by Ruth Ashby and Deborah Gore Ohrn; Rabble Rousers: 20 Women Who Made a Difference, and the titles in the Who Was? series for reference.) On the other side, list "Fast Facts" such as when and where she was born and notable achievements.
- Write a newspaper article about an important event in women's history. For example, Who Was Amelia Earhart?, by Kate Boehm
 Jerome, details Amelia's flight across the Atlantic; You Want Women to Vote, Lizzie Stanton?, by Jean Fritz, details the 1848 Women's
 Rights Convention in Seneca Falls, New York. Scan the books for information and incorporate Who, What, Where, When, Why and
 How facts into an article about these events. Write from the perspective of someone who lived at that time or was on the scene.
- Paint a mural. Use tempera paint on butcher paper to create a mural depicting a historic moment in women's history such as the Seneca Falls convention.

. . . AND STRUT THEIR STUFF

To demonstrate understanding students may:

- Perform a skit or put on a play. Write a scene depicting an important moment in one woman's life such as Sacagawea meeting Lewis
 and Clark (see Who Was Sacagawea? by Dennis Brindell Fradin and Judith Bloom Fradin); Mamie Johnson meeting baseball legend
 Satchel Paige in A Strong Right Arm: The Story of Mamie "Peanut" Johnson; or Elizabeth Cady Stanton wearing bloomers for the first
 time in You Want Women to Vote, Lizzie Stanton?
- Stage a quiz show. Students come up with questions to test classmates' knowledge of women's history. For example: "This woman
 founded Hull House on September 18, 1889." The correct response is "Who is Jane Addams?" Students take turns being contestants
 and compete three at a time. Likewise, students take turns posing questions. Establish rules that make sense for your class. Invite
 another class to be the "studio audience."
- Turn the classroom into an interactive Women's History Museum. Display timelines, portraits, and writing. Perform skits in costume. Invite
 parents and other community members on opening day, then schedule times for other classes to visit.

PROMOTING WOMEN'S HISTORY

- Create a Women's History table and window display.
- Host a series of readings by female authors. Visit www.penguinputnam.com/authorappearances for author suggestions.
- Booksellers: Customize a reading list. Include fiction, nonfiction and biography and be sure to represent women from different cultures
 and time periods. Distribute the list to teachers and make it available to children when they visit the bookstore or library. Challenge
 young customers to meet a self determined reading goal. Reward their efforts.
